the town of Inverbervie, between Montrose and Stonehaven. The group managed to procure a derelict piece of land next to the church and has developed it into what they call The Voyage of Life Garden. It has a sunken garden, and undulating surroundings leading to а small lighthouse. The site of this garden is right next to the local primary school and the children are often in the garden working. Brighter Bervie managed to get the Beechgrove Garden people in to start them off and had the assistance of a Chelsea landscape gardener. It looked fantastic and if ever you are up that way you must go in and see it.

Hercules Linton, who designed and built the Cutty Sark was born in Inverbervie and there is a nod to him in the garden and about the town. In 1341, because of a storm at sea, King David II and Queen Johanna were forced to land at Inverbervie and the townsfolk treated them so well they were granted a royal charter. So, Inverbervie is not just any old town, it is a royal burgh.

The DBHS Syllabus shows that our next Friday meeting is a visit to Cairn o' Mhor Winery near Errol in Perthshire. This visit will now take place on Saturday 7th May 2022. Cairn o' Mohr is situated between Perth and Dundee and we have organized the visit so that cars will be taken. Daffies and P3 at Donibristle Primary School

Each year, in October, DBHS plant 30 pots of six Tete-a-Tete miniature daffodil bulbs with P3. These are for exhibiting in the Schools Competition of the Cale Spring Show, held at the beginning of April the following year. His was done in October 2021 and in February 2022 the pots were moved round the school building and put in the sunshine to develop. The pots were due to be judged near the end of March 2022 when the best six would be taken and entered in the Cale Show. Pauline and I went up to the school to judge the pots and discovered that in each one of them, the daffodils had passed. All had died. Early in March, the weather had been so good and the daffodils had developed nicely, but all of them had now died. P3 were really quite disappointed.

Pauline and I went to the Cale Spring Show to return the trophies and had a sneak preview of the entries. All entries were of the variety Jetfire. The schools at the Edinburgh side of the river are supplied the bulbs by the council. I like to enter with Donibristle PS, who have their bulbs supplied by DBHS, to keep Fife in the running. I must say we are usually successful and have had P3 Donibristle PS on the Schools Trophy more than a couple of times.

The Recipe

3 Cheddar & Lavender Scones

Ingredients:

80g self-raising white flour 150g Cheddar, grated 100g self-raising wholemeal flour 175ml full fat milk 65g malted bread flour 1 egg, beaten, for brushing Pinch of salt Plain flour for dusting 1 tbsp finely chopped lavender

Method:

Heat the oven to 220C. Mix the flours together in a bowl. Mix in the salt, lavender and 100g of the grated cheese. Add most of the milk and mix until evenly combined. Slowly add enough of the remaining milk to form a soft paste.

Tip the mixture onto a lightly floured work surface and lightly fold it together to form soft dough.

Gently roll the dough with a rolling pin or flatten with your hands to a rough circle. Cut out 6 rounds using an 8cm plain cutter. Brush the tops of the scones with beaten egg and sprinkle with the remaining cheese. Transfer them to a baking tray. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes until risen and golden brown.
