### Flower of the Month February

The **Viola** - symbolises loyalty and faithfulness.



Violas are small flowers that vary in colour and shape, depending on the specific variety. Each flower consists of thin, delicate, and flat, curved petals with a soft, smooth, and silky consistency. The petals also differ in colours, some with solid hues of bright yellow, orange, royal purple, or maroon, while others display showy combinations of purple, white, and yellow with dark violet splashes of accent colouring and striping. Violas are unique as the entire flower is edible, and the blooms contain a crisp, succulent, and tender texture with a faint, perfumed scent. The colourful flowers also bear a subtly sweet, vegetal flavour with light mint and wintergreen nuances.
